Bonus depreciation is a powerful tax incentive that allows investors to deduct a large portion of an asset's depreciable basis in the year it's placed in service, rather than spreading it over decades.

Example: Invest in a qualifying convenience store or gas station property today and deduct a significant portion of that cost *this year*.

How it Works .

TRADITIONAL DEPRECIATION:

Deducts small amounts over 15 to 39 years.

BONUS DEPRECIATION:

Deducts 100% of the asset's depreciable basis upfront.

ONE BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL ACT (OBBBA)

The One Big Beautiful Bill Act was officially **signed into law** on July 4th, 2025, **permanently reinstating 100% bonus depreciation**.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

Under this new legislation, 100% bonus depreciation is now available indefinitely for qualified property acquired and placed in service on or after January 19, 2025, without any sunset provision. This means investors or businesses can fully expense eligible assets in the year of acquisition.
